Programs and Services

Residential Services

We offer two homes, the Atrium & the Arches, that provide continuous long-term care and support for up to 40 residents with intellectual and developmental disabilities and extensive support needs.

Respite Services

Horizons offers a group community-based respite program on weekends for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities living in the community. This is a CARF accredited program provided to support and provide relief to the primary caregiver(s).

Day Programming

Horizons day program offers adults, in our residential program, the daily opportunity to advance personal skills, learn, explore interests, develop social relationships, participate in their daily care, and enjoy recreational experiences of choice.

Medical Services

Health care services are provided on-site via our Medication Technicians, Nurses, Dietician, Physical Therapist, Speech Language Pathologist, Medical Director, and contracted medical services (dental and labs); as well as, off-site via coordination with primary care physician.

Operations Update

- Horizons has fully integrated the use of the speech Language Pathologist and Physical Therapist into the residents' daily programs. The specialists provide on-going training to ensure that the personalized speech and physical therapy development goals are met.

- Provided transportation services to activities involving the family (i.e. bowling, church, library, Victory Junction Camp, etc.)
